The Wild Hog in the Woods, Inc. is a notr-profit, non- stock corporation whose primary purposes are to provide quality folk music, folk arts, and folklore in a coffeehouse atmos-phere and to educate the public about folk music, folk arts, and folklore, and about co-operative business. The organization will operate a coffee house on a co-operative and non-profit basis, keeping admission and food proces just high enough to cover the expenses. ## MEETING OF THE GENERAL MEMBERSHIP

Officers. The Coordinating Committee then held a special meeting to select officers. The Committee reached consensus on Beth Merit (255-2814) as High Hog in the Woods and Pam Mansfield (256-1425)as Treasurer.

4. Tape. The membership decided to purchase a master tape of our first benefit music festival at Freedom House.

5. Rent. We agreed to pay Green Lantern Eating Co-op \$250 in rent in advance in January to help out their cash flow.

5. Coffeepot. The membership declined to jointly purchase a two urn coffeepot with Green Lantern. Two coffeepots have already been donated.

7. Quilts. Material is needed for quilts for our walls. Please drop it off at Spud nuts or Green Lantern. Several people will be sewing the quilts and decorating starting at

noon.

8. Publicity. Press Connection will send a reporter to our opening. We'll be sending press releases to all local newspapers (except MNI papers, whose employees are still on strike) and to the radio stations. Postcards will be sent to non-members on our mailing list announcing our opening.

9. Newsletter. This newsletter includes: minutes of this meeting, announcement of regular meetings of th Coordinating Committee our opening events, and a summary of By- Laws.

10. Food. A Food committee was organized for our opening.

ll. <u>T-Shirts</u>. Wild Hog in the Woods Teeshirts may be available by the time of our opening.

The Wild Hog in the Woods is your organization. You, the members, have the final decision-making power in all cases.

Because we can't all get together every week to make the necessary decision, a 12person Co-ordinating Committee (CC) is elected twice a year at membership meetings. The CC meets at least once a month at a time and place announced in the newsletter. All members are invited to attend these meetings and to participate in discussion, though only CC members vote.

The CC will, in turn, organize volunteer to carry committees out the operation of the coffeehouse--booking performers, buying food, etc. The organization has two officers (required by law) The High Hog in the Woods is a total figurehead, with no more power than anyone else. The Treasurer is responsible for keeping the books and reporting at each membership meeting.

There will be four regular meetings of all the members each year. They will be announced at least two weeks in advance in the newsletter. The membership can enact policies, repeal the policies set by the CC revise the By-Laws, remove officers and members of the CC at any meeting. Pro posals for impeachment and removal must be published in the newsletter two weeks prior to action. If you are dissatisfied with the operation of the coffee house and want to see changes made, propose them to the CC first. If you're still not satisfied, you ean call a special membership meeting by collecting signatures of 10% or 50 members. The decision of the membership is final.

The By-Laws may be amended by two-thirds vote of the membership at any membership meeting. Proposed amendments must be published in the newsletter at the same time as the meeting is announced.
