GORDON BOK IS COMING TO MADISON

The Madison Folk Society is sponsoring a concert by folk musicians Gordon Bok and Bob Zentz, on Tuesday, April 3, 1979, at 8 pm in Great Hall.

Gordon is an excellent singer, songwriter and storyteller from Camden, Maine, who plays 6- and 12-string guitar, and has an attention-holding baritone voice. He performs traditional sea songs of many countries, other traditional and contemporary songs, guitar instrumentals, and songs and stories of his own composition many of them concerning the sea, sailing, seals, and the Maine coast. At one time Gordon served as first mate on the Hudson River Sloop Clearwater. A more informative article about him can be found in the January 22, 1979, issue of Time Magazine.

Bob Zentz started and runs Ramblin' Conrad's Folklore Center in Norfolk, Virginia, and plays 14 different instruments, including banjo, guitar and hammered dulcimer. (I'm

sorry, but I don't know the others.) He's also a science fiction fan and has written some interesting science fiction oriented songs. Bob performs traditional, contemporary, and his own songs, and his song "Roll Back the Days" (or "Sweet Song of Yesterday") is currently on the Top 10 Folk Parade of the Midwest.

Gordon and Bob each have several albums available through Folk Legacy. They don't get out to the Midwest very often, so this is a rare opportunity to see them in concert. If you're familiar with these two fine folk musicians, please be sure to tell your friends about them.

Tickets will be \$3. More specific information about the concert and ticket availability will be announced at the Coffeehouse. Folks who can not contain their excitement and/or want more information immediately can try calling me at 256-1425
