His songs from that recording have been finalists in the Great American and Great River Folk Festival song contests and runner-up in the international www.SongoftheYear.com competition. His "Testify" was a finalist in the 2015 Madison Area Music Association's (MAMA) Awards.

Dave Hopper picked up the guitar in 1965 and managed to remember a ton of Sixties songs – despite the adage about people who grew up during that era. He went through various phases of folk, rock, and blues, adding electric bass in the 70's. Today he plays in many musical ensembles including Duggleby/Hopper, the acoustic trio Still Strummin', and a four-piece rock cover band Better Daze.

Guitar League Chapter to Launch in Southern Wisconsin

Guitar League USA has announced that its first United States expansion chapter will be located in southern Wisconsin. Guitar League is an educational and social organization dedicated to sharing the love of guitar among its members through monthly meetings, featuring interactive presentations. Headed up by musician Evan Riley, the new GL Chapter will hold its inaugural meeting at 7:00 PM on Monday, November 16 at the Edgerton United Church of Christ at 114 North Henry Street, Edgerton, WI. Future meetings will be held on the 3rd Monday of each month from 7-9 pm.

Based on a baseball metaphor, the Guitar League's unique tiered format appeals to all skill levels ranging from Rookies (beginners) to Minors (intermediate) to Majors (pros). Monthly meetings include a general session featuring a Main Presenter (usually a skilled gigging musician sharing a mix of playing and talking), followed by simultaneous breakout sessions for Rookies, Minors and Majors. Members are invited to attend any breakout session based on their interest and skill level. Members' personal skills often grow from Rookie to Minor to Major level.
