8:00 - 10:30pm	Kelly's impressive rendition of dust bowl ballads caught all of our attention at Woody Guthrie night a few years ago and again this summer. His strong vocals and unique guitar playing will be complemented by his wife Kathy's vocals and percussion playing. His debut CD "Through the Mirror" has been released by Snailish Records. Look for a probable open mic by Wayne Hunt.
Friday, October 8 8:00 - 10:30pm	Roxanne Neat The Hog is happy to welcome back Roxanne for what will undoubtedly be an evening of enjoyable music. She is a skilled and tasteful singer and plans to bring her guitar and banjo. Expect to hear traditional and contemporary folksongs, as well as a few originals. She also performs in area venues such as the Café' Carpe in Fort Atkinson.
Friday, October 15 8:00 - 10:30 pm	Red Tail Ring This duo hails from the directional extremes of Michigan. With roots firmly planted in Appalachian old- time and folk music, they branch out to forge new arrangements complete with haunting harmonies and an expansive dynamic range. Michael Beauchamp, a native of Kalamazoo, uses his powerful voice and mourn- ful guitar licks to spin melodic yarns about lost love, travel and the importance of live music. Laurel Premo of the Upper Peninsula shares music drawn from Appalachian, Scandanavian, folk and blues roots. She sings and plays claw hammer banjo, guitar, violin and cittern. He performs mostly 1920s and 1930s swing on accordion with Dave backing him up on guitar. Get there early if you want a seat as Uncle Dick has been drawing some pretty big crowds to the Hog.

You may recognize Tom from Harmonious Wail or The Dang-Its. Dave has played with just about everyone else at one time or other.
