Make Music Madison

Make Music Madison is a free, volunteer-led, citywide celebration of music that takes place on the first day of summer, June 21. In its 2013 inaugural event, Madison joined 700 communities worldwide in this global celebration. Debuting with 280 concerts at over 100 locations, Madison hosted the second largest number of concerts of any city in the U.S.

Again in 2014, Make Music Madison will bring music and fun to neighborhoods all across the city. There will be a wide diversity of musical talent spanning all genres, ages, ethnicities and skill levels, performed in parks, community centers, fire stations, public and private outdoor spaces and more. Each neighborhood, group or individual has the opportunity to plan and host its own celebration, aided by citywide matchmaking software and publicity.

Madison Folk Music Society and Madison Songwriters Guild are joining forces to host an event at Elizabeth Link Peace Park on State Street. Ron Dennis and Stephen Lee Rich will be selecting performers made up of folk musicians, songwriters and youth. The plan calls for continuous music from 9:00 am until 7:00 pm.
